The Carcross/Tagish First Nation Learning Center is proceeding along as the building structure has now begun being erected. The delay in column supply has not held us back and the cooperating weather has made the problem more manageable.

Completed Items

- Both the sewage holding and fire suppression tanks are placed and backfilled.
- Backfill is progressing to a workable level and will be finished in the New Year.
- Floor joist package has been completed.
- Building structure consisting of glulam's, columns and purlins in the process of being erected.
- Ketza framed walls on the ground while waiting for columns to arrive.
- Generator set to arrive this week.

Upcoming Items

- Continue to finish building 'B' structure and awaiting delivery of building 'A' columns.
- L & M on site staining material and clear coating.
- As the structure goes up the roofing sub-contractor will be working closely behind Ketza to seal buildings.
